# What can Payers and RBMs do to improve LCS uptake?

- Make it easier for patients to get screened
- Eliminate pre-authorizations
- Keep up-to-date on eligibility criteria for LCS
- Be engaged and ask questions

# What can the Radiology Profession do to assist?

- Help educate navigators, utilization managers, pre-auth team members about eligibility criteria
- Educate and be a resource for health care providers, especially primary care providers
- Talk with patients and be willing to review CT findings with patients
- Become involved in state cancer coalitions
- Speak to community groups, business organizations, participate in health fairs

## What do you need to do to prepare for screening?

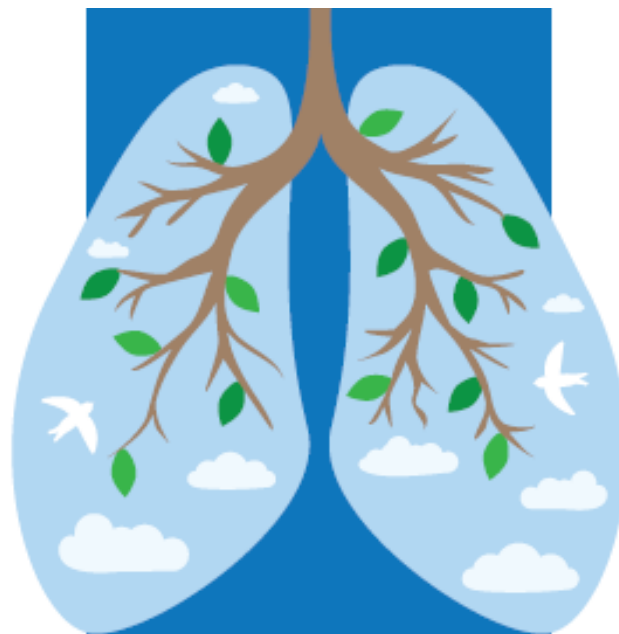
- It's a good idea to receive counseling to quit smoking if you currently smoke.
- You should see your primary care doctor about the benefits, and limits of screening with Low Dose CT scans.
- You should check with your insurance provider to see if you need a referral for screening.
